Session Time Allocations: Most sessions are 120 minutes long (with four presenters); other are longer (with more presenters) or shorter (with less presenters.) Each Presenter should take no more than 20 minutes; each Discussant should take no more than 3 to 5 minutes; any remaining time should be devoted to questions from the audience.

Session Chairs: Assume overall responsibility for your session. Make an effort to contact the session participants before the meeting. Inform them that each presentation room will be equipped with an overhead projector and flipchart. Ask them if they have any special needs relating to their presentation and/or discussion and, in collaboration with the registration desk, try to satisfy those needs. College of the Holy Cross, Worcester, MA, USA



Victor A. Matheson is a Professor of Economics at the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA, USA. He has published extensively in the field of the economics of collegiate and professional sports including studies of the economic impact of the Super Bowl, the World Cup and the Olympics. He is president of the North American Association of Sports Economists and the Associate Editor of the Journal of Sports Economics. He has also worked as a referee in the top professional and intercollegiate soccer leagues in the United States.

Going for the Gold: The Economics of the Olympics

Countries vigorously compete for the right to host sports mega-events such as the Summer Olympics. In part this is done in hopes of generating an economic impact during the event but also long-term growth induced by the hallmark event. However, mega-events in general, and the Olympics specifically, have increasingly become extraordinarily expense undertakings. This paper examines the economic history of the Olympics Games with an eye towards changes that can be made in the bidding and hosting process that can make the Games an economically sustainable event.
